Bees wrap up season with Class AA Championships The Baldwinsville cross country team completed their season with an eighth place finish in the Section III Championships at Vernon-Verona-Sherrill High School on Saturday (11/6). FM swept the field of 11 teams by placing their top five runners across the finish line before any other runners finished giving them a perfect score of 15 points. FM's Tommy Gruenewald, a sophomore, was the individual winner, registering a time of 16:15 on the muddy 3.1 mile course.



Tim Gaulrapp led the Bees as he has in every other race this season. Tim finished in 19th place with a time of 17:54. Following Gaulrapp was Greg Houghtaling in 39th place with a time of 18:50. Cory Greczyn was next for the Bee's in 47th place with a time of 19:10, followed by Dan Petrik in 50th place with a time of 19:14. Josh Coyne was right on Petrik's heels, finishing in 52nd place with a time of 19:18 to complete the Bees' team score.

Helping to displace runners from other teams were Baldwinsville runners Chris Bock (56th, 19:25), and Jason Jones (61st, 19:39). Following them were Bill Hennessey (77th, 19:46), Mike Jones (86th, 20:04) and Marc Schoeberlein (89th, 20:36). A total of 109 runners completed the race.



Bees finish 15th at OHSL meet

Baldwinsville put up a good effort at the annual league meet, despite missing two of their top runners. Tim Gaulrapp (at left) was once again in the driver's seat for the B'ville squad, completing the 3.1 mile course at Tully High School with a time of seventeen minutes and forty two seconds to finish in 34th place. The Bees missed the efforts of Gary Reisman and Kevin Kribs, both of whom have been sidelined due to injuries. However, Greg Houghtaling (in picture at right) and Cory



Greczyn did their part to help with damage control as they both ran excellent races. Greg finished in 63rd place with a time of 18:13, with Cory only 7 seconds behind him in 18:20, good for 73rd place. Dan Petrik also ran an excellent race to finish fourth for the Bees in 104th place with a time of 18:50. Jason Jones completed the scoring for the Bees with a time of 19:06 for 126th place. Bill Hennessey displaced other runners with a 159th place finish in a time of 19:43. A total of 262 runners competed in the varsity boys race.

The JV Bees came up with an eleventh place finish in a field of 34 teams. The JV squad was led by Josh Coyne who placed 27th in a time of 19:07. Only a few strides behind Josh was Chris Bock, placing 34th with a time of 19:14. Chris (pictured at right) had an excellent race after returning from the injured list. Mike Jones was next with a time of 19:35, good for 57th place, followed by Marc Schoeberlein in 89th place with a time of 20:09. Chris Nelson completed the scoring for the Bees with a 147th place finish in a time of 21:11, followed by Chad Melvin in 21:53, good for 172nd place. A total of 266 runners competed in the race.



Bees end '04 regular season at Marathon Invitational, 10/24
Baldwinsville runners ended their regular season with a 10th place finish in the seeded division with 398 points. That score places them 11th in the entire field of 40 complete teams.

The day was cool with the morning fog giving the runners a ghost-like appearance as they warmed up on the hills above the tiny village of Marathon. It was a perfect fall morning for a cross country race and a large field from Central New York and the Southern Tier had assembled. Unfortunately, the large field provided some serious challenges to race organizers. A good number of the 273 runners in the boys varsity race reported having to slow to a jog as they attempted to pass through some of the narrower trails on the course. Perhaps in part due to that fact, the field never had the opportunity to spread out as much as it would in most races. This produced a finish that at one point threatened to overwhelm the finish line officials, producing some questions as to the accuracy of the runners final placement.

Baldwinsville front-runner Tim Gaulrapp managed to avoid most of the above mentioned problems with an excellent start. He held a position in the mid-teens through most of the race finishing in 19th place with a time of 17:55. Kevin Kribs was next for the Bees in 59th place with a 18:43 clocking, followed by Greg Houghtaling in 82nd place with a time of 19:04. The remainder of the varsity squad appears to have been affected by the crowding on the narrow portions of the course. Cory Greczyn finished 109th in 19:25, followed by Jason Jones (129th, 19:32), Josh Coyne (133rd, 19:35), and Mat McGinnis (134th, 19:35).



The JV Bees did an excellent job in their race finishing in 3rd place in the team scores behind CNS and Ithaca. A total of 17 complete teams made up the JV field.

Baldwinsville's Dan Petrik (18th, 19:18) and Bill Hennessey (22nd, 19:22) both ran excellent races to lead the JV squad. Jason Smith also ran a strong race to finish 3rd on the team with a time of 19:42, good for 35th. Chris



Bock (44th, 20:01) and Marc Schoeberlein (59th, 20:29) completed the Bees' team score.

Other Baldwinsville runners competing in the JV race were Mike Jones (61st, 20:34), Chad Melvin (117th, 21:40), Sean Falconer (126th, 21:46), Chris Nelson (134th, 21:58), and Carl Smith (138th, 22:01). A total of 206 runners competed in the JV race.

Bees end dual meet season 6-2 The Bees finished up their '04 season dual meets with a double win on Wednesday, Oct. 14th. In a non-league meeting, the Bees easily ran by Fulton, 21 - 40, while compiling a score of 15-46 versus Fowler.

Tim Gaulrapp continued to lead the Bees on the hilly five kilometer layout around the Burnet Park golf course. Tim was clocked in 17:35 to take the individual win. Kevin Kribs had an excellent race to finish just behind Gaulrapp for 2nd place with a time of 17:42. Fulton runners Alex Fisher and Scott Stevens took 3rd and 4th places respectively, followed closely by Greg Houghtaling in 5th place with a time of 18:03. Cory Greczyn and Zach Dale completed the Bees' scoring effort with 6th and 7th places. Greczyn was timed in 18:16 while Dale registered 18:26 to finish ahead of Fowler's top runners. Jason Jones (10th, 18:33) and Josh Coyne (11th, 19:01) contributed to the Bees victory by displacing the remainder of the runners from both Fulton and Fowler.

Bees take 4th at Rome Invitational The Bees came up with a pair of 4th place finishes at the Bill Coughlin Invitational in Rome this afternoon (10/9). In the varsity race, Sauquoit Valley was the team champion with 48 points. Holland Patent beat out Vernon-Verona-Sherrill by a point, 78 to 79, for second place. The Bees were next with 138 points, while the host, Rome, rounded out the top five teams with a score of 148. A total of 13 complete teams competed in the varsity race.

South Lewis's Josh Arthur was the individual varsity race winner with a time of 16:09. Tim Gaulrapp was the Bees' top runner, completing the course with a 17:18 clocking, good for 11th place. Kevin Kribs (pictured at right) was next for the Bees in 24th place with a time of 17:54. Completing the Bees varsity scoring effort were Greg Houghtaling (32nd, 18:16), Cory Greczyn (34th, 18:23), and Zach Dale (37th, 18:25). Displacing other runners for Baldwinsville were Mat McGinnis (40th, 18:26) and Jason Jones (43rd, 18:30)



In the JV race, Dan Petrik was the front runner for Baldwinsville. Dan finished the course with a time of 18:34, good for 3rd place among the 90 plus runners in the field. Josh Coyne was next for the Bees, finishing with a time of 18:55 and placing 11th. Completing the scoring for the JV Bees were Mike Jones (14th, 19:14), Jason Smith (33rd, 20:07), and Marc Schoeberlein (39th, 20:27). That

gave the Bees a team score of 100 points, to place them behind team champion Holland Patent with 23 point, runner-up Sauquoit Valley with 63 points, and third place RFA with 80 points. A total of 7 teams competed in the JV race.

Bees defeat Wildcats, fall to Warriors Baldwinsville split their double dual meet this afternoon (10/6) with a 16-46 victory over West Genesee, while falling to Liverpool 17-46.

The Liverpool victory kept the Warriors undefeated, and sets up an exciting end of the season dual next Wednesday between Liverpool and CNS.



In the individual results, Tim Gaulrapp led the Bees with a 4th place finish behind the individual winner Colin Heenan of Liverpool. The winning time was 17:10 with Gaulrapp being clocked with a time of 17:26. Kevin Kribs was next for the Bees in 10th place with a time of 17:46, followed by Greg Houghtaling in 12th place (18:03), Jason Jones (pictured at left) in 13th (18:13), and Cory Greczyn in 15th (18:19). Completing the varsity entries were Zack Dale in 16th place (18:24) and Mat McGinnis in 19th place (18:40).

Competing on the junior varsity team were Josh Coyne (19th, 18:46), Dan Petrik (23rd, 18:56), Bill Hennessey (31st, 19:26), Jason Smith (34th, 19:38), Marc Schoeberlein (39th, 19:57), and Mike Jones (42nd, 20:06). Also running for the Baldwinsville JV squad were Chad Melvin (46th, 21:13), Chris Nelson (49th, 21:45), Greg Massaro (55th, 23:20), and Carl Smith (23:21).

Baldwinsville competes with state ranked teams at McQuaid, The Bees traveled to Rochester's Genesee Valley Park on Saturday (10/2) to compete in the 40th Annual McQuaid Invitational. Running in the seeded large school race, the Bees finished in 12th place in a field of teams that included team champion Fayetteville-Manlius (currently the top ranked team in New York State) and runner-up Lockport (currently ranked 2nd in the state)..

FM's Jared Burdick was the individual champion, completing the wet, muddy 3 mile course with a time of 15:12. Tim Gaulrapp led the Bees with a 16:44 clocking, good for 43rd place and a medallion. Kevin Kribs and Greg Houghtaling were next for the Bees, both recording a time of 17:13, good for 66th and 67th places respectively. Cory Greczyn (pictured at right) was the 4th Baldwinsville scorer in 73rd place with a time of 17:23, while Matt McGinnis completed the team score with a 89th place finish in 17:41. Completing the Baldwinsville



varsity entry were Zach Dale (92nd, 17:50) and Jason Jones (97th, 18:01).

In the JV race, Dan Petrik was the top Baldwinsville entry. Petrik ran a time of 18:03, good for 20th place to finish just ahead of teammate Josh Coyne in 26th place with a time of 18:07. Completing the JV scoring effort were Bill Hennessey (59th, 18:34), Mike Jones (67th, 18:57), and Marc Schoeberlein (80th, 19:02). Other Baldwinsville JV runners included Jason Smith (91st, 19:10), Chad Melvin (111st, 20:00), Carl Smith (192nd, 20:32), and Chris Nelson (194th, 20:39). In the JV team scores the Bees' finished 9th in a field of 21 teams.

Bees beat Buccaneers, lose to Northstars The Bees came up with their third dual meet win of the season as they ran by Oswego 20 to 42, but couldn't keep up with the high flying CNS Northstars, as CNS came away with the win with a score of 20-41. CNS also beat Oswego 20-43.

Oswego's Jake McAndrew led the field of over 70 runners, finishing with a time of 15:49. McAndrew was followed by CNS's Ben Ludivico in 16:25. Tim Gaulrapp led the Bees with a third place finish of 16:41.

Despite the loss, the Bees respond to the excellent racing conditions and great competition by running excellent times. Almost every runner on the team showed improvement over their effort at last Saturday's Baldwinsville Invitational.

Varsity takes 3rd place trophy at Baldwinsville Invitational - The Bees captured third place in the team scores in the Varsity A race behind state ranked Ithaca (31 points) and Central Square (61 points). The Bees amassed 86 points to finish ahead of 4th place Elmira Southside with 89 points.

Central Square's Ben Adams was the individual race winner with a time of 15:39 on the 3 mile layout. Adam's finished just ahead of Oswego's Jake McAndrew who captured second place with a 15:43 clocking. Tim Gaulrapp was Baldwinsville's top finisher, completing his race with a time of 16:51, good for 8th place. Kevin Kribs was the next B'ville runner to cross the finish line, placing 13th with a time of 17:07. Greg Houghtaling and Corey Greczyn were next for the Bees, finishing in 17th and 25th places respectively, with times of 17:20 and 17:41. Jason Jones and Mat McGinnis completed the Baldwinsville varsity entry registering times of 17:50 and 17:55, good for 25th and 28th place.



The results of the JV race mirrored the varsity race as Ithaca came away with the team champion honors with 20 points. Central Square nipped the Bees for second place with 86 points to the Bees' score of 89. A total of 19 complete teams competed in the JV race.



Josh Coyne was the Bees' top individual runner in the JV race, recording a 18:00 clocking to finish 7th. Zach Dale was next for the Bees, with teammate Dan Petrik right behind. Dale finished in 15th place with a time of 18:23, while Petrik was clocked in 18:27, good for 17th place. Bill Hennessey (22nd, 18:37) and Mike Jones (28th, 18:48) completed the Baldwinsville team score.

Bees open dual meet schedule with double win - The Bees ran by Rome 23-35, while defeating Henninger 19-44, in their first dual meet of the 2004 season. Baldwinsville's Tim Gaulrapp cruised to a first place finish in a field of 70 runners at the Black Knights home course behind Staley Jr. High School. Gaulrapp was clocked with a time of 17:57 on the 3.1 mile layout featuring a mud pit and a stream crossing. Kevin Kribs was next for the Bees, finishing in 3rd place with a time of 18:15. Greg Houghtaling was the next Baldwinsville runner to cross the finish line. Houghtaling registered a time of 18:30, good for 6th place overall. Jason Jones was next for the Bees in 8th place with a time of 18:46, with teammate Cory Greczyn right behind in 9th place at 18:53. Matt McGinnis (10th, 18:58) and Chris Bock (12th, 19:07) completed the Bees varsity squad, displacing a number of scoring runners from both Henninger and Rome.

both the Varsity and JV squads came away with first place team finishes for the second week in a row. The varsity team scored 51 points to capture the team title ahead of Tully (71), Pulaski (98), Saranac Lake (108), Beaver River (110), Franklin Academy - Malone (139), and Watertown (158). A total of thirteen schools competed in the race.

In the varsity race, Beaver River's John Munger was the overall individual winner with a time of 17:39 for the 3.04 mile course. Baldwinsville's Tim Gaulrapp and Gary Reisman finished in 2nd and 3rd place respectively with times of 17:53 and 17:54 on the challenging, hilly course. In the JV team got the ball rolling by recording a team score of 18 points to capture the JV trophy. Baldwinsville's Matt McGinnis and Cory Greczyn led the field for virtually the entire race, with McGinnis winning the finishing kick to capture the individual win. Both boys were timed at 13:47 on the 4 kilometer course. Josh Coyne and Chris Bock finished in 3rd and 4th place respectively for the Bees, also recording identical times of 14:16; while Mike Jones wrapped up the Baldwinsville scoring with an 8th place finish in a time of 14:33.

In the varsity race, Baldwinsville scored 52 points to finish ahead of 2nd place Brighton (61 points) and 3rd place Chittenango (78 points) in a field of eight teams. Brighton's Joey Friedman was the individual winner with a time of 12:27, while Tim Gaulrapp and Kevin Kribs led the Bees with 5th and 7th place finishes respectively with times of 12:54 and 12:55. Gary Reisman was next for the Bees, finishing 11th in 13:18; with Greg Houghtaling (14th, 13:30) and Jason Jones (15th, 13:31) finalizing the scoring for the Bees.
